## Introduction

Elections were held in 279 local authorities across England on 5 May 2011, as well as for the Scottish Parliament, Welsh Assembly, Northern Ireland Assembly and all 26 local councils in Northern Ireland. A UK-wide referendum on the voting system used to elect Members of Parliament to the House of Commons was held on the same day.

The British National Party (BNP) stood 257 candidates in the English local elections, plus 32 candidates across all eight regional lists for the Scottish Parliament; 27 candidates for the Welsh Assembly, most of whom stood for the five regional seats; three candidates for the Northern Ireland Assembly; and four candidates in the local council elections in Northern Ireland.

This total of 323 BNP candidates across the UK was significantly lower than the 877 candidates the party stood the last time these seats were up for election in 2007, or the 739 BNP candidates that stood in the local elections in 2010. This reduction in electoral activity is just one sign of the accelerating decline of the BNP since its high point in 2009, when two BNP candidates were elected to the European Parliament and Nick Griffin appeared on the BBC's *Question Time*. This report will examine in detail the BNP's poor performance and the reasons for their collapse.

The BNP's problems have brought opportunities for others on the far right. A total of 36 former BNP activists and candidates, including sitting councillors, stood for a range of other far right parties or as Independents in these local elections. This report will discuss whether this fracturing of the BNP, combined with the growth of the English Defence League, holds the potential for a political and organisational realignment of Britain's far right.

The far right paid little attention to the referendum on whether to move from a 'First Past the Post' voting system to the 'Alternative Vote', or AV, for Parliamentary elections. The BNP took a position against AV, but in reality campaigned little on the issue. Both the pro-AV and anti-AV campaigns argued that their positions provided the stronger defence against extremist parties, but this issue played only a minor role in public debate on the topic. For these reasons, this report does not include an assessment of the AV referendum campaign.

## British National Party

The British National Party (BNP) approached the 2011 elections in extremely poor shape. The party had not yet recovered, organisationally or psychologically, from the devastating blow of the 2010 local elections, when they lost almost half their sitting councillors and were wiped out in their stronghold of Barking & Dagenham.

Since that defeat, the BNP's internal divisions and financial problems, caused almost entirely by poor leadership and gross mismanagement, have magnified, to the point that the party faces a genuine threat of bankruptcy. The BNP leader had tried to lance the growing rebellion in his party shortly after the 2010 elections by announcing that he would step down in 2013, but this move failed to placate most of his internal opponents. Instead, Griffin's purges of BNP members continued, depriving the party of large numbers of activists in key areas, and he faces a leadership challenge in July 2011.

Given this background, it is unsurprising that the number of BNP candidates in the 2011 local elections fell far short of previous levels. There were a total of 323 BNP candidates in the elections, of whom 257 stood in the English local elections; 32 on the eight regional lists for the Scottish Parliament; 27 for the Welsh Assembly, most of whom stood for the five regional seats; three for the Northern Ireland Assembly; and four in the local council elections in Northern Ireland. For comparison, the last time this set of seats was up for election in 2007, the BNP stood a (then) record 877 candidates. Last year, the party stood 739 candidates in the local elections and 338 in the General Election.

## English Council Elections

The BNP's strength has always been concentrated in England rather than the Celtic nations, and the fall in the number of BNP candidates reflects a collapse in BNP manpower and campaigning resources in some parts of the country. In 2010, the BNP's presence was strongest in the North East, Yorkshire & Humberside, the East Midlands and the East of England regions. Yet this year, they had no candidates at all in Gateshead, compared to 16 in 2010; nine in Newcastle upon Tyne, compared to 24 last year; four in Kirklees (21 last year); two in Leeds (31 last year); and two in Southend (17 last year).

In Rotherham, which was widely tipped as the BNP's next growth area after a good performance in both local and general elections last year, the BNP stood just six candidates, compared to 11 in 2010. In 2010, the BNP stood full slates of candidates in South Tyneside, Basildon, Thurrock and Sandwell. This year, they managed just one candidate in Basildon, two in Sandwell, seven in Thurrock and seven in South Tyneside. In large parts of the country, the BNP virtually disappeared from the ballot paper.

The only places where they maintained a significant presence that was comparable to their 2010 efforts were in Barnsley, where there were 19 BNP candidates, compared to 21 in 2010; Birmingham, where they stood 15 candidates (although this was still half the 30 candidates they stood in 2010); Stoke-on-Trent, where they stood 10 candidates, five of whom were defending BNP-held seats, compared to nine in 2010; and Coventry, where the BNP stood 13 candidates, having not contested any seats at all there in 2010.

This decline in BNP activity was mirrored by a poor return from the electorate. Just two of the BNP's 257 candidates won their seats, and only 18 managed a second-place finish. The BNP's total vote of 62,213 came at an average of 8.3% of the votes cast in the wards they contested. When this set of seats was last up for election in 2007, the BNP's 877 candidates polled 301,390 votes at an average of 14.7% per ward.

While the collapse in the total vote is explained by the vast reduction in the number of BNP candidates around the country, the fall in their share of the vote where the BNP did stand is a welcome development. The party polled poorly

in many places that were former BNP strongholds, in large part because they could not muster enough activists or leaflets to conduct any effective campaigning. Having benefitted in many areas from voters turning away from Labour when they were in Government, the BNP now suffered in the face of a resurgent Labour vote.

The two seats that the BNP did manage to hold on to were both won by sitting BNP councillors who were defending their seats: Catherine Duffy won in East Goscote ward, Charnwood Council, in the East Midlands; and Lynda Cromie held her seat in Queensbury ward, Bradford. However, the BNP lost all five of their council seats in Stoke, completing their removal from a council which had a peak of nine BNP councillors in 2008; the council is now BNP-free for the first time in eight years. They also lost sitting councillors in Burnley, Boston, North West Leicestershire, Thurrock, Staffordshire Moorlands and Sevenoaks (the BNP could not even find candidates to defend their seats in the last two locations). They polled well once more in Rotherham, getting 16.7% in the six wards they contested, but could not convert this into any victories, although three of their candidates came second.

This leaves the BNP with a total of 13 local councillors (excluding parish councillors) around the country, eight of whom are up for re-election next year. From a high point of over 50 local councillors and a member of the London Assembly just two years ago, the BNP's presence in local government is in danger of disappearing completely.

## Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland

The BNP's chronic failure to build up a strong activist base outside England is reflected in the fact that in these elections most of their candidates in Scotland, and several in Wales, were actually English. The BNP stood a total of 66 candidates in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, but in truth it was only in Wales where they had any hope of winning a seat, by benefitting from the proportional voting system used for the regional seats.

In Wales, the BNP hoped to build on a respectable showing in 2007 when they polled 42,197 votes for the regional seats and almost reached 10% of the vote in Wrexham. Nick Griffin even spent the last week of campaigning in Wales, having given up on his party's fortunes in England. However, their hopes were to be dashed: the BNP vote fell from

4.3% in 2007 to 2.4% this year, despite Griffin's eve-of-election prediction that they would win a seat in the Welsh Assembly.

Winning a seat in the Scottish Parliament was never a realistic prospect for the BNP. Despite standing four candidates for each of the eight regional Scottish Parliamentary lists, in only one – Glasgow – did they poll more than 1% of the vote. This was a pitiful effort, and it was a similar picture in Northern Ireland: none of the three Assembly candidates or four local council candidates came close to winning a seat. Throughout the United Kingdom, this was, for the second year in a row, a disastrous election for Britain's foremost far right party.

## Other Far Right Parties

While it is normally the case that some of Britain's smaller far right parties stand a handful of candidates in elections, this year's poll was distinguished by the number of former BNP members and even councillors who defected from the party to stand under the name of a rival group, or as an Independent. A total of 36 former BNP activists stood for a range of parties, in a development which tells us much about the internal state of the BNP, and a little about the possible future direction of the British far right.

The greatest beneficiary of this phenomenon was the **English Democrats Party** (EDP): 15 of their 136 candidates around England were former BNP members or supporters. Of these, four were in Broxbourne, three in Leeds and two in Liverpool. They include some high-profile BNP activists, such as Chris Beverley in Leeds, who works as a personal assistant to BNP MEP Andrew Brons; Nick Cass in Kirklees; Graham Partner, a sitting BNP councillor in Leicestershire; and Ramon Johns, a former BNP councillor in Broxbourne. The best results amongst the defectors came in Fenside ward, Boston, where the EDP won two council seats, one of which was taken by former BNP member David Owens.

The EDP is not an openly racist party, and its chairman, Robin Tilbrook, was quoted in *Searchlight* magazine saying that they only accepted former BNP members who had renounced racism. However, *Searchlight* also believes that there are other senior activists in the EDP who are more open to the far right. The embrace of defectors from the BNP may lead to internal discontent, or may help drag the EDP towards a more radical, anti-immigrant form of English nationalism.

The **England First Party** (EFP) is a small party set up by veteran far right activist Mark Cotterill in 2004. It briefly held two council seats in Blackburn in 2006 and is more openly extreme than the BNP. The EFP stood 10 candidates in these elections, of whom two were defectors from the BNP. Six of their 10 candidates were in Stoke; this was also the location of their best result, with former BNP activist Mark Leat coming third with 19.2% of the vote in Sandford Hill ward.

The **National Front** (NF) stood 21 candidates, including six in the Scottish Parliamentary elections. Seven of their 15 candidates in England were BNP defectors. Their strongest presence was in Kingston upon Hull, where they had five candidates. None of the NF's candidates in England or Scotland came close to winning a seat.

Three former BNP activists stood under the name **Democratic Nationalists** in Bradford; all lost, although James Lewthwaite came second with 11.3% of the vote in Royds ward. In Stoke, the former organiser of the BNP group, Alby Walker, and his wife Ellie, stood for **Community Voice**, again without making an impression. One BNP defector, Paul Rimmer in St Michaels ward, Liverpool, stood for the **United Kingdom Independence Party**, coming fifth.

Two more tiny far right groups, the **British People's Party** and the **English People's Party**, stood one candidate each, in Calderdale and Leicester respectively, without success. Six former BNP activists stood as **Independents** in various places around the country. Only one, Tony Simmonds, came close to winning a seat; he came second with 30.9% of the vote in Broadway & Longton East ward, Stoke-on-Trent.

## Analysis

These results continue the downward spiral which has gripped the BNP since its election failure in 2010. There had been internal dissent, expulsions and leadership challenges before that date, but most BNP members were willing to tolerate Nick Griffin's autocratic and impetuous leadership style as long as the party was doing well. As soon as their run of electoral success came to an end, the justification for allowing Griffin a free hand also disappeared. Griffin reacted to their defeats with typical bombast, putting it down to a conspiracy between *Searchlight*, the *Guardian* and the Labour Party. While *Searchlight's* Hope Not Hate campaign repeated its sophisticated and wide-ranging campaigning strategy of 2010, and the revival of Labour's fortunes did erode the party's vote, the reality is that the BNP's poor results were more the consequence of their own failings than of any other single factor.

In particular, the leaching of members and, more importantly, activists, from the party over the past 18 months has created a lack of capable organisers and damaged party morale. The most prominent departure has been that of Eddy Butler, previously the BNP's elections organiser (and a relatively competent one), now the leader of the purged opposition. For Butler, Griffin is "the root cause of the electoral decline we are seeing...the BNP is no longer a political party but a vehicle for Nick Griffin and his overblown ego." Prior to the elections, Griffin faced a leadership challenge from veteran fascist Richard Edmonds which was unlikely to succeed. The election debacle intensified discontent within the party so much, that in June Griffin's fellow MEP, Andrew Brons, announced his candidacy, replacing Edmonds as the sole challenger. Brons carries much more support within the party than Edmonds, and poses a more serious threat to Griffin.

There is history in this: Griffin, Brons and Griffin's close advisor Patrick Harrington were leading figures in the factional infighting which ripped apart the National Front in the 1980s. Then, Brons was the victim of Griffin and Harrington's scheming; this time around, he bided his time and tried to give the impression of neutrality while others lead the attack. In March, Brons issued a statement criticising both sides in this dispute. He described Harrington in acerbic terms as "a no-nonsense man who does not waste valuable time learning from his own

mistakes"; but he also attacked Butler for generating "entirely negative propaganda" which, Brons argued, only served to demotivate BNP activists.

Speculation that Brons was preparing the ground behind the scenes to challenge Griffin grew after his statement, two weeks after the election, that unless Griffin made significant changes to the BNP constitution he would back Edmonds for the leadership. After this threat, Griffin's attempts to manipulate both the substance and the process of planned constitutional changes to ensure he continued as leader forced Brons' hand, and the two MEPs will now fight it out for control of the party. Griffin has worked hard to create a party constitution which makes it very difficult for him to be removed as party chairman; whether he manages to hold on to power, or Brons outmanoeuvres his long-time colleague and rival, remains to be seen at the time of writing.

A complicating factor is the fact that the BNP is on the brink of financial disaster, largely, again, due to a series of disastrous decisions by Griffin. The party's combined debts are thought to be in the region of £500,000. This includes an estimated £170,000 in damages paid to Unilever after the BNP used a picture of a Marmite jar, without permission, in a 2010 election broadcast. It also includes unpaid tax, staff salaries and bills to external contractors. There is a growing sense that, even if Griffin could be removed from the leadership, the party may not be worth taking over.

With the decline in the BNP's electoral fortunes, Griffin has hinted that the party may look to other avenues for future activity. The week after the elections he wrote on the BNP website:

"I know that some people thought that I was exaggerating the need for us to move into pastures new – things such as the successful demonstration and ultimatum to the cross banning by Wakefield housing – where Labour and for that matter the BBC-backed safety valve UKIP cannot follow us. If so, I hope that the bruising experience of this election will have convinced them that I am right, and prepared them to follow the lead that I and my leadership team are going to be giving over this summer."

The BNP has not held street demonstrations and marches for many years, but Griffin has changed his political stance many times during his career, and a move back to street politics would not

be beyond him. The rise of the English Defence League (EDL) as an action-orientated, radical nationalist street movement poses a real threat to the BNP's status as Britain's leading far right organisation.

Griffin's first response to the EDL was to label the group a 'Zionist' front and proscribe EDL activity for BNP members, but he has struggled to keep the two entirely separate: at least two EDL activists stood for the BNP in the local elections (Nigel Shipman in Bolsover and Stuart Bates in Birmingham), and there is some anecdotal evidence of BNP and EDL supporters joining forces to attack left-wing meetings.

The EDL leadership claims that their movement is not neo-Nazi or racist, but rather calls for an English nationalism that is open to all. The reality is often different, both in terms of the people who attend EDL demonstrations and the xenophobic and racist rhetoric used by EDL activists in public and on internet message boards.

The EDL, too, are currently suffering from an internal split, with activists from the north of England moving towards a more openly racist, violent politics and building alliances with neo-Nazi groups in Yorkshire and the North East, while the southern-based leadership tries to maintain its position that it rejects neo-Nazism and welcomes a diverse membership. A recent EDL demonstration in Blackburn saw fighting erupt between northern and southern EDL members and the two sides increasingly represent two distinct organisational entities, with parallel demonstrations in different parts of the country on the same day.

Meanwhile, the number of former BNP activists who stood for the English Democrats provides further evidence that English nationalism – albeit a xenophobic and bigoted version – increasingly offers more appeal than the racial nationalism which has long been the core belief of the BNP, and the NF before it. This form of English nationalism is anathema to Andrew Brons and veteran racial nationalists, but it has increasing appeal for the generation of BNP members who joined the party under Griffin's leadership, and who are not steeped in the neo-Nazism which was openly practised in the BNP during John Tyndall's tenure as party leader in the 1980s and 1990s. Indeed, it is not too far removed from ideas promoted by Nick Griffin when he was a leading figure in the National Front and the International Third Position in the late 1980s and early 1990s.

It is possible to imagine a future far right in which parts of the EDL, BNP and other radical English nationalists coalesce around a xenophobic, right-wing populism, both on the streets and in elections, that sits outside the democratic norms of the Conservative Party and much of UKIP, but falls short of overt racism and neo-Nazism. While this kind of politics is currently quite marginal electorally, the appeal of the EDL shows that it has real potential.
