Origins of this projects


- Set up by Nottingham Jsoc in 2014
















Inclusivity: Did you feel that the event was inclusive for all?




Inclusivity: Which organisation could do more to improve inclusivity?





Positive Jewish Experience in Nottingham

- "I wear a kippah openly at university and used to wear my tzitzit out for a few months. I've never experienced anti-Semitism on my campus. In fact, I've experienced curiosity and encouragement more than anything from both Jews and non-Jews."
- ► No responses informing of anti-Semitism on campus
- "I think coming to Nottingham has heightened my sense of Jewish identity. I have a lot more Jewish friends which has encouraged my Judaism. I have also brought some of my Jewish friends who had not grown up in a strictly Jewish background to Jewish events. "

Key Finding - The need for a JSoc House in Lenton

- Need to have a base in Lenton to accommodate a central location for most students to access
- Would allow the JSoc to have a space for more speakers and promote inclusivity

What's happened since?

- Findings were presented to UJS and UJIA
- ► Helped to inform successive Jewish societies
- ▶ Led to motion being put forward at UJS conference in December 2015
